The meeting was called to order at 5:32pm. Chairman Brenda Smith welcomed everyone to the meeting, reviewed the agenda and asked each member to share an update from their area. Each member gave a short update.

OWEB update by Gary Marshall – OWEB board member: Gary Marshall gave a presentation on the history of OWEB for board members. He talked about the makeup of the OWEB board and the areas that were represented. Gary also talked about the current situation with Covid & staff members as well as expected funding for the upcoming biennium. The Ag Heritage Program and the Governor's 100 year water vision are still projects but are not funded as of this time.

Achieved consensus on and submitted a legislative concept (LC) dedicated to developing a fund for domestic well users

Ecological Working Group and Vegetation Management Working Group completed their Step 2 and 3 reports

Process designed for wrapping up Step 2 and Step 3

Selected Aspect Consulting to conduct the Water Market Feasibility Study Partnered with University of Oregon cartography students who developed a storymap that

illuminated historic groundwater and surface water allocations in the basin (for free)



Collaborative discussions on topics related to defining reasonably stable began.

Holly also shared a Gant sheet with plans for the 2021 year.

Holly shared that the next Water Planning meeting is set for next week, January 26th from 4:00 to 7:30 and shared the agenda. Information for Community Based Water planning can be found on the Council's website on the CBWP page, and also on the new Harneys Water Planning website.

Brandon Haslick gave a short update on what the Coordinating Committee has been working on. The Committee is also working to make sure that there is representation from all areas of the basin within the collaborative. They feel that it will be important to have each area represented when we move to surface water discussions in the next phase.

Karen had prepared the resolution and read it for Council members as well as sharing it on the screen over Zoom. After discussion Ben Cate moved to accept the resolution as presented. Rachel Beaubien seconded and the motion was approved. Karen will work at gathering signatures on the Resolution and will send to Holly for forwarding on to Bureau of Reclamation.
