# Harney County Watershed Council

The meeting was called to order at 5:35pm. Chairman Jamie McCormack welcomed everyone to the meeting, reviewed the agenda and asked each member to share a short update on what is happening in their world.

Members shared that they are finishing up OWEB grants for the spring submission. Most are waiting on snow to thaw to start getting out in the field. Turn out is late for permittees on both the BLM lands and the Forest Service. Roads will need attention after all the snow and ice this winter.

## **Continuing project updates/action items**

### **Community Based Water Planning update:**

Karen shared that the April meeting was successful. OWRD gave an update on the 512 and Division 10 rules. The first Division 512 Rules Advisory Committee meeting will be held on April 25<sup>th</sup>. The Coordinating Committee is discussing how to approach the development of the Critical Issues list. All work groups are continuing with their Step 2 and Step 3 plans and are on track to completing work in a couple of months. Next Full Collaborative meeting is scheduled for April 20<sup>th</sup>.

## **Strategic Planning:**

We are still talking about an article regarding the Surface Water portion of Community Based Water Planning. Karen will talk to Holly.

With regards to the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary gathering, there was discussion on another "history of the Council" article to be planned for the August timeframe. The Sub-committee can hopefully have some preliminary ideas by the May meeting.
